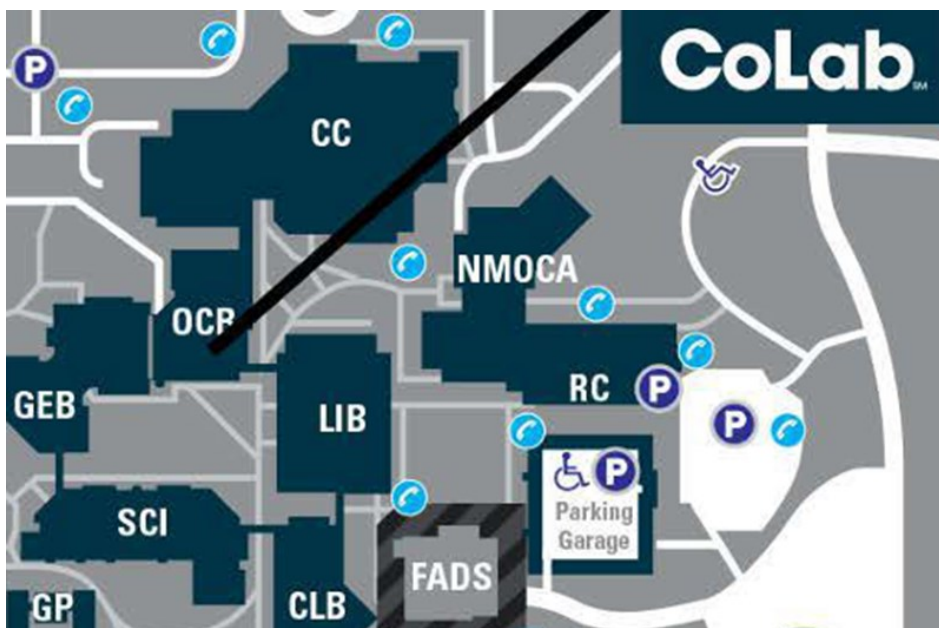

The process provides status information on student financial aid recipients to the education finance industry and the Department of Education's National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS). 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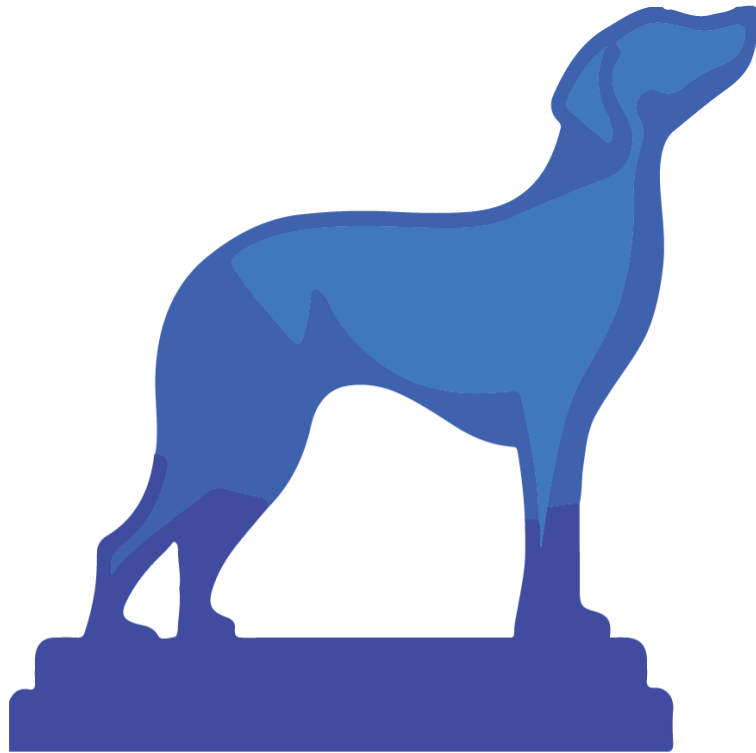
